Category	Clinical Feature	Description	
		Yes = 	
1	Continuing pain disproportional to the inciting event		
2	Subjective report of at least one symptom in three of the four following categories:		
2.1.	Sensory: hyperalgesia or allodynia		
2.2.	Vasomotor: temperature asymmetry and/or skin colour changes and/or skin colour asymmetry		
2.3.	Sudomotor oedema: oedema and/or sweating changes or sweating asymmetry		
2.4.	Motor/Trophic: decreased range of movement and/or motor dysfunction (weakness, tremor, dystonia, experience paralysis) and or trophic changes (hair, nail, skin)		
3	Objective display of one sign at the time of evaluation in two or more of the following categories:		
3.1.	Sensory: hyperalgesia to pin prick and/or allodynia to light touch, and/or temperature sensation and/or deep somatic pressure and/or joint movement		
3.2.	Vasomotor: temperature asymmetry (>1 deg C) and/or skin colour changes and/or skin colour asymmetry		
3.3.	Sudomotor oedema: oedema and/or sweating changes or sweating asymmetry		
3.4.	Motor/Trophic: decreased range of movement and/or motor dysfunction (weakness, tremor, dystonia, experience paralysis) and or trophic changes (hair, nail, skin)		
4	There is no other diagnosis that better explains the symptoms and signs
